

## Constitution

1. The name of the society is Project Brotherhood Society
  
2. The purposes of this society are:
  - a. To build and donate houses that meet the basic needs of people living in impoverished communities who would not otherwise have the means of providing adequate shelter for themselves.
  
  - b. To provide food, clothing and basic supplies in Canada and abroad for those without the means of providing such necessities for themselves.
  
  - c. To provide medical relief for those whose life is at risk because they do not have the means of providing it for themselves due to the predominant condition of poverty.
    - i. By building medical clinics in communities where such care is lacking.
    - ii. By providing basic medical instruction.
    - iii. By providing medical and nutritional supplements and education that may improve the health of those afflicted.
    - iv. By providing the means for people who suffer life threatening illnesses to receive proper medical care.
  
  - d. To provide the means for children and adults to begin or further their classroom education where financial, physical or other constraints prevent them from doing so.
    - i. By creating and/or building schools where children and adults can attend classes and improve their literacy and practical knowledge.
    - ii. By providing scholarships for children and youth whom are unable to pay for their education due to financial limitations.
    - iii. By providing the means for physically and/or mentally challenged to initiate or further their education.
    - iv. By providing literacy instruction for those whom lack or have weak literacy skills.
  
  - e. To help physically and/or mentally challenged individuals obtain greater independence and actively participate in all areas of society.
    - i. By encouraging, in an inclusive manner, active participation in the charitable activities of the Society that enable them to develop their talents and abilities and to overcome the challenges they face.
    - ii. By promoting skills required to function in society, including self-advocacy (enabling physically and/or mentally challenged individuals to recognize their special needs for the purpose of minimizing the impact of their disabilities), communication skills, self-determination, and collaboration with others in various settings.
  
  - f. To provide meals and hampers for people in Canada and abroad who have not the means of providing sufficiently for themselves.
  
  - g. To provide the means for people in impoverished communities to utilize or improve their skills in order to help them become self-sufficient.
    - i. By building community centres in areas where none are accessible, therefore providing training and improving the lifestyle of those in the area.

- ii. By providing training in literacy and basic nutritional and medical care.
  - iii. By establishing development programmes which will provide specifically the necessities that will enable people and communities to improve their lives.
- h. To organize summer day camps for children in Canada who face special challenges adapting to their community because of background, language, and/or customs with the purpose of teaching them how to better integrate to the community.
  - i. To preserve, protect and improve the natural resources and environment of impoverished areas through the implementation of recycling and educational programmes.
3. Business will be carried out to support the main purpose of the group without individual profit. Our fundraising is to be carried out on an exclusively charitable basis. This is unalterable.
  4. The purpose of this society shall be carried out without purpose of gain for its members, and any profits or other accretions to the society shall be used for promoting its purpose. This is unalterable.
  5. In the event of dissolution of this society, funds remaining after all debts have been paid shall be transferred to a charitable organization with purposes similar to those of this society. If this cannot be done, funds shall be transferred to another charitable organization recognized by Revenue Canada as qualified under the provisions of the Income Tax Act of Canada. This is unalterable.
